A sample list of mostly English words that likely derived from the Hebrew word כרע koraa [bend, crouch, bow]

כרע derivatives – Mostly involve bending, crouching or moving in a bent manner

curl, caracole - and also the etymon of the 'creep' related words 'creep, Grk. herpein [creep], – crooked - herpes, reptile, caracol [snail] and crepuscular [ = of animals that are active primarily at twilight - Cf.

serpere –[creep] - groin? – crochet

Crump, scrumple, crumple – curb – crimp – crozier – coral – corral – kraal – crown – Ger. Krug [jug] – cruller – cruse – carafe – Eng. Crease – OFr. Crochir [be bent] – crinkle – coracle [wicker boat] $^{724}$  Polish kurcz [cramp] - crumple – cruse – to Lat. Crus [lower leg]

Incidentally, the term 'crocodile' itself probably derives from the Hebrew כרע korah [crouch, bow] as do more than twenty other 'CR' form English and occidental terms<sup>725</sup> – as a future article will G-d willing, demonstrate.<sup>726</sup>
